

the enemy (devil) sows weeds in (God's) field (Matt. 13.24-30).

But allegorising parables runs into trouble: the Friend at Midnight (Luke 11.5-8) importunes someone for bread? Allegory: the one being importuned = God. But God is tucked up in bed with his family, and cannot get up to give him something. Who is the family, and what is the image of God?! What kind of help is a God who can't be bothered to get out of bed because he's tucked up in bed with his family?!




Parables as allegory: Even worse with the Parable of the Widow who kept pestering the Unjust Judge (Luke 18.1-8). Is Jesus really saying that God is like an unjust judge who only gives in if we bang on the door hard enough and annoy him sufficiently?

Both parables are unique to Luke's gospel = 'L' material? Unusually for Luke, little narrative context or a general introduction in Lk. 18.1 – 'pray always, not to lose heart'
